
I am writing on behalf of the more than 100,000 members of Canadian Federation of Students-British Columbia at the direction of our provincial assembly.

As the labour dispute at your Richmond, BC locations enters its fifteenth month, university and college students continue to be opposed to IKEA's bargaining position and the anti-worker actions of your corporation. Many of our members rely on IKEA products because of their low price and variety of delivery options; however, we do not want these benefits at the expense of workers' ability to earn fair wages and feed their families. The fact that your company has locked out any group of workers for more than a year is unreasonable and shameful.

I have been directed by my members to urge IKEA Canada to settle this dispute immediately and to provide the workers in Richmond a fair deal. If IKEA Canada continues in its anti-worker agenda, and unfair lockout in Richmond, our organization will actively undertake a campaign to encourage our members to not shop at any IKEA in Canada. This campaign will include working with our partner student organizations in each province, as well as our national organization.

We truly hope that IKEA Canada can consider the value of its brand in the student market and that students have no patience for actions such as have been taken by IKEA Canada in this dispute.
